



Kazakh Uyghur

The Uyghur are a Turkic people primarily in northwestern China, with origins tracing back to nomads from Siberia. Uyghur literally means "allied", and they often work as "middlemen" between East Asia and Europe, or are involved in manufacturing, mining, oil drilling, trading, and transportation.

Of the 356,000 Uyghurs in Kazakhstan, many are attending post-secondary education and have left China because of government oppression and persecution. Diasporic communities are spread around Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, and western China, as well as smaller communities around the world, including an estimated 2,500 in Canada.

Although the Bible has already been translated, and Christian radio broadcasts and the Jesus Film are available, many of the Muslim Uyghurs have been taught that Christinanity is a threat to their faith and are therefore resistant and distrusting to evangelical efforts. Only 0.01% are Christians.

PRAY WITH US:

Father, we thank you for your faithfulness towards the Uyghurs. We earnestly implore you to surround them with your light and love; soften the soil of their hearts to receive the message of the Gospel. We pray that the Holy Spirit would meet them in their quest for truth and that they may discover the knowledge of their true identity in You. May the Kazakh Uyghurs experience the radical love of Jesus, their Mediator, and lead them back to you, Father. Amen.

Vietnamese Diaspora in Cambodia

There is a long history of Vietnamese immigration into Cambodia, including a 10-year occupation (1979-1989) which led to a deep distrust and hatred of the Vietnamese people.

Approximately 835,000 Vietnamese live in Cambodia, often searching for a better life and not finding it. A vast majority live in extreme poverty and lack access to basic needs. AIDS and tuberculosis are rampant among those living in floating villages. Many earn their living as fishermen, vendors, and common labourers.

Most identify as practicing Mahayana Buddhism, but are unfamiliar with Buddhist teachings. Many are tied to ancestor worship and animism, believing that spirits and deceased relatives have power over the lives of the living.

Only 0.17% of the Vietnamese in Cambodia are Evangelical Christians, and while many resources are available, there is little to no gospel access in most other regions of the country.

Canada is home to over 275,000 Vietnamese people.

PRAY WITH US:

Dear God, please bless the Vietnamese people in their ardent search for meaning. We pray for an encounter with the Holy Spirit who will lead them to freedom and truth. Would you please anoint the work of your Church in Cambodia, that they may boldly proclaim the gospel message and introduce the Vietnamese people to the love of their Saviour? We pray for their physical needs, that You would provide their daily bread and cure them of their diseases. May they come to know Jesus as the light of the world, not walking in the darkness but having the light of life. (John 8:12). Amen.





Laotian

The Lao people reside primarily along the Mekong River, preferring to live alongside rivers or plains for ease of transport to sustain their many industries. While most support their families through farming, fishing, and raising livestock, many people also find a living as blacksmiths, carpenters, miners or producers of craft pottery, tobacco, and charcoal.

For centuries, animosity and political tension between Russia, China and Vietnam, and a period of French invasion resulted in bloody land wars, leaving many Laotians with a deep sense of unrest. Laos is home to nearly 90% Buddhists, only 2% of which are Evangelical Christians. As a primarily Buddhist nation, they are firm believers in the concept of reincarnation, a cycle of life and rebirth, changed through rituals, sacrifices, and detachment to earthly life. The ultimate goal is for the soul to reach nirvana.

PRAY WITH US:

Dear heavenly Father, we praise you for the incredible gift of the Laotian people. You know them all by name, and have blessed them with incredible gifts and creativity and resilience. God, we ask that you heal the hearts of these people, and meet them in their needs.

Lord, as the Laotians live along the Mekong River, would you lead them to the waters of salvation and that they would come to know the true and living water. Release them from anything that holds them back from living in freedom, so that they may find true rest in the knowledge that the work has already been done and fulfilled through Jesus. May they experience His love in ways they could have never fathomed. This we ask in the name of Jesus our Saviour. Amen.



Approximately 25,000 Laotians call Canada home.

Sorani Kurd

The Sorani Kurds are an ethnic group that primarily reside in northern Iraq and western Iran. Kurds are the largest ethnic group in the world without a state of their own. Kurdish society arose from a nomadic way of life. Tension and strife between clans and communities are typical; and while this strengthens their own tribal identity, as a whole, tribalism tends to weaken and fragment their overall Kurdish identity. Historically, the Sorani Kurds have faced political and cultural suppression, especially under the regimes of Saddam Hussein in Iraq and during the Pahlavi dynasty in Iran.

Sorani Kurds are predominantly Sunni Muslims, though there are also Christian and Shia Muslim minorities in the region. Their religious adherence is typically nominal in nature, perhaps due to some connection to the ancient Zoroastrian faith. Only 0.03% Evangelicals have been identified in the region.

PRAY WITH US:

Jesus, we proclaim your truth over mountain tops! Your words remind us that "whoever believes in you will have eternal life" (John 3:15). We pray for tender hearts in this region, so that the gospel may fall on ready and hungry ears. We pray that you reveal your glory to the Sorani Kurds and root them in the light of your truth. We pray that they will find their identity in you and that they will discover the freedom that has already been purchased for them by the blood of Jesus. May all praise, honour, and glory be to you! Amen.





Badini Kurd

The Badini Kurds speak a dialect of Kurmanji, the largest Kurdish language. They usually inhabit regions of northern Iraq, especially around the Dohuk and Zakho areas, as well as parts of Syria and Turkey. The Badini endeavour to make independent decisions from Iraq's Baghdad government. They are typically farmers who raise goats and cattle. Amidst war and rebellion in the land, the Badini have endured much suffering and persecution, including water scarcity that has affected their agricultural industry.

Most Badini are Sunni Muslims. There is a smaller group of rebels that have been associated with secret and unorthodox Muslim sects. Only 0.14% of Kurds in Iraq have been changed by the Gospel so mission work often faces many challenges.

PRAY WITH US:

Jesus, light of the world, break through the darkness and cause every lie to fall, and bless the Badini Kurds with visions and dreams of the Saviour of the world. "May your light shine out of darkness and into their hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:6). We pray that you would bring a spirit of unity and peace amongst the Badini people, so that they discover the fullness of truth that can only be found in you. Lord, you know each of these people by name. Would you please bring delight into their families as they experience the richness of your mercy and love? We look forward to your return, and on that day, may we find many of the Badini Kurds among those who call upon the name of the Lord. Amen.







Yezidi

The Yezidis are indigenous to Kurdistan but now primarily live in the Nineveh province of northern Iraq. Yazidism is an ethnic and monotheistic religion, believing in a creator god who left 7 archangels to rule the earth. The "Peacock Angel" is particularly revered in the culture. In centuries past, the Yezidis have endured religious persecution from Arabs, Persians, Turks and Sunni Kurds.Yezidis have faced centuries of systematic violence, with significant massacres in the 20th and 21st centuries, including the 2014 ISIS genocide. Despite these hardships, the Yezidis have a resilient cultural identity, maintaining their language, rituals, and social structures, and striving for religious freedom and recognition.

Despite having many translated resources available, including the Jesus Film and the Bible, there are only 0.14% of believers in the area. There are approximately 1,800 Yazidis in Canada.

PRAY WITH US:

Lord, in confidence we draw near to your throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need (Hebrews 4:16). We lift up the Yazidi people to you, O Lord. You have bestowed upon them strength and resilience to endure tremendous suffering. We pray that you would continue to bring healing to this land, and that you would shine your light in areas that remain in darkness. We pray that as their hearts seek the divine, that they would encounter your Holy Spirit and experience a radical transformation. Lord, please bring workers to this field, so that the Yazidi people may experience the truth of the gospel and find wholeness in their identity in you. Amen.



Yemeni Refugee Diaspora

Approximately 7 million Yemenis have emigrated from Yemen, a large majority of which have fled their home due to the ongoing conflict, violence, and economic collapse in their country. Refugees have settled in nearby countries including Saudi Arabia, Oman and Jordan, but have gone as far as Europe and North America. According to the UN Refugee Agency, 14% of the Yemeni population remain internally displaced. Those who have left Yemen work as labourers abroad, sending most of their financial resources home to family. The diaspora faces challenges, including legal barriers, limited access to services, and discrimination. Many Yemenis continue to be the crucial voice for raising awareness about the ongoing crisis in Yemen. Islam is the official state religion of Yemen, with only 0.02% identifying as evangelical Christians.

Around 8,000 Yemeni people call Canada home; as of 2023, Canada has resettled 532 refugees.

PRAY WITH US:

We recall the words of Isaiah 42:16 over the Yemeni Refugees: "And I will lead the blind in a way that they do not know, in paths that they have not known I will guide them. I will turn the darkness before them into light, the rough places into level ground. These are the things I do, and I do not forsake them."

Father, your children are dispersed all over the world, seeking refuge and protection from oppressors. Jesus, we pray for your hand of protection over them, as you guide their path and lead them to safety. We pray for favour over legislation and bureaucracy, that you would make a way for them to settle peacefully into a new home. As they encounter a different reality in a new environment, would you bring alongside heralds of the gospel, that the Yemeni people would discover the life-changing truth of a Saviour who is rich in mercy and abounding in steadfast love? This we ask in Jesus' name, Amen.

Southern Thai

The Southern Thai speak a variant of the Thai language, and practice a folk Islam mixed with animism, despite the country being predominantly Buddhist.

The Southern Thai Muslims maintain strong ties to Malay Islamic culture, with practices like halal food and prayer playing a central role in daily life. They usually live on beaches and marshy swamp lands which are laden with fish that get exported to other countries. Fruit and rice farming and cattle production also dominate the agricultural economy as well as producing rubber and coconuts.

Family ties are important to the culture, with various generations often residing in a single dwelling. Various ancestral customs and rituals have also prevailed, including the worship of supernatural objects and appeasing spirits through prayer, sacrifices and offerings. Some villages may have a "bomo", a kind of an exorcist and spiritual healer.

About 20,000 Thai call Canada home and the vast majority are Buddhist.

PRAY WITH US:

Dear Lord, please transform the hearts of the southern Thai to a soil that responds to your good news of salvation. We know that you have their names engraved at the palm of your hands (Isaiah 49:16). Thank you for the love of family that you have imbued into their hearts. Would you use these strong relationships to forge pathways for the gospel message to be proclaimed boldly? We pray for divine appointments with people of peace so that all the people of Thailand would realize their need for a Saviour. In Jesus' name, Amen.





Chinese Diaspora in Mexico

Chinese migrants arrived in Mexico around the mid-19th century partly as an effort to help modernize the country as railroad, mining and agricultural labourers. A majority of the Chinese diaspora have preserved their culture and traditions and have established communities primarily in Mexico City and northern regions, blending their cultural heritage with Mexican customs.

Their religious affiliations tend to combine a mix of Buddhism, Taoism and Confucianism, combined with beliefs in astrology and reverence for (or fear) of deceased spirits. Nevertheless, religious practices do not have great bearing on their daily lives. Almost half of the population do not adhere to any religion; however, 8% are believers.

They faced discrimination, xenophobia and exclusionary policies, like the 1930s anti-Chinese laws. Nevertheless, the Chinese diaspora prevailed and are now an influential part of society through their contributions to various sectors from business to politics.

PRAY WITH US:

Lord God we praise you for you are sovereign and just! "Let all the peoples praise you!" (Psalm 67:3) Father, you created all people with your image and likeness and have written the law into our hearts. We pray that the Chinese Diaspora in Mexico would come to the light of this truth and that they would catch a glimpse of the eternal plan that you have for all who call upon your name. We pray that your love would penetrate the hearts of the Chinese and that they would step boldly into the call that you have placed on them.

We especially pray for the handful of believers in this community. Embolden their faith that they may use their position of influence to preach repentance and lead others to salvation. Holy Spirit, we leave this ministry in your hand and trust in your plan. Amen.

Tajik

The Tajik people are an ethnic group native to Central Asia, primarily residing in Tajikistan, but also found in significant numbers in Afghanistan, Uzbekistan, and other parts of the region. They are usually farmers and shepherds. They have faced oppression from Russians, with whom they equate Christianity; therefore, many are resistant to the Christian message. They are predominantly Muslim, with only 0.01% Christians.

Local house churches and international missionaries share the gospel through utilizing Biblical stories and figures that are familiar to Muslims particularly found in the book of Genesis. However, since adhering to family ties are of utmost importance, renouncing Islam to follow Jesus continues to be a dangerous decision.

Their language is a variety of Persian and is a central component of their identity. Tajiks have historically been involved in agriculture, trade, craftsmanship, literature and art. They are renowned for their warm hospitality and a deep sense of community. Approximately 5,000 Tajiks call Canada home.

PRAY WITH US:

We recall the words of Paul to the Corinthians: "For God, who said, 'let light shine out of darkness', has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:6). We call upon the name of Jesus to bring light and freedom to the Tajik people. With their hearts having a propensity towards beauty through music and literature, we pray that the gospel message would be transmitted through the art that they are drawn to. Utilize the gifts that you have blessed this land with, so that the Tajik people would find the satisfaction and wholeness that only a relationship with Christ provides. May the few believers in this land be rejuvenated in their missionary identity and that they would continue to bravely share the need for repentance and restoration. Bless the Tajiks with the peace of a secure identity in you. Amen.





Spain-Basque

The Basque people have lived in the Pyrenees mountains between Spain and Southern France since before the Roman Empire. They have preserved their strong sense of regional identity through tradition and their unique language called Euskara and have been a distinct group apart from Spain.

The Basques were traditionally farmers, sheep herders and fishermen. They are industrious people with strong work ethic, playing a key role during the Industrial Revolution as ship builders.

Basque culture is thriving in mostly peaceful regions of Spain, although there is a small group of separatist "freedom fighters" who are attempting to force Spain to give the Basque people independence. While there is a large Catholic Christian religious identity in this region, the Christian faith has been watered down through generations and have been mixed with cultural traditions and celebrations.

PRAY WITH US:

Jesus, we call upon the promises made in 2 Chronicles 7:14 where you say: "if my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land." We praise you that the Christian message is known by most of the Basque people in Spain. We pray for a revival in your Church in this region. Please fill them with truth and love, and that you would shed light into areas that are no longer walking according to your statutes. We pray that the simplicity of the gospel would be resurrected in the hearts of your faithful. We pray that they will come back to repentance and be restored back to the fullness of your truth. Lord, we praise your faithfulness to the people of Spain. Please bless evangelization efforts in this land, that churches would be united as Jesus prayed in John 17. Holy Spirit, bring revival to the Basque people and renew them in their spiritual journey. Amen.

North Africans in Spain

People from North African countries like Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia and other Maghreb countries moved to Spain around the mid-20th century to flee from political instability and meet labour shortages in agriculture, construction and manufacturing. The migrants now live in Southern regions including Andalusia and the Canary Islands.

While many North Africans in Spain are Muslim, they also maintain strong cultural ties to their countries of origin, preserving their languages (Arabic, Berber) and cultural traditions, including food, music, and dress. Despite growing social and cultural influence, many migrants continue to face issues such as limited access to housing, education, and employment, as well as xenophobia and Islamophobia.

More than 438,000 North Africans live in Canada.

PRAY WITH US:

Father, we pray a blessing over the North Africans that you ignite a desire and longing for them to know the truth and experience the personal love of God. You are the King who knows the story of every person from beginning to end. We pray for the Christians amongst the North Africans in Spain, that you would "open a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ" (Colossians 4:3). We pray that the Holy Spirit would come to this region and shine His light to the everlasting hope that is offered to all those who call upon the name of Jesus as their Saviour. We pray for protection over those who have already decided to follow you. Jesus, please fill them with courage and boldness to testify to their Christian faith and share the reason for their hope so that they may lead everyone around them to you. Amen.





Sunda

The Sunda people are the largest unreached people group in Indonesia. Because of the abundance of fertile soil in West Java, they were traditionally rice and tea farmers. However, many are now involved in business and politics, due to the rise of industrial development and housing projects. Despite this, statistical data show that there is a high poverty rate in the area.

Almost all Sunda people are devoted Muslims. They deeply value family and cultural ties and have thus protected Sunda culture throughout generations, keeping it intact and distinct from the rest of Java culture. The Sunda practice traditional ceremonies to keep in harmony with the natural world and many have beliefs about the legend of a reincarnated god called a 'dewata' who dwells in earth to protect mankind. Only 0.06% of people are associated with the Evangelical faith.

PRAY WITH US:

Bless the Lord, O my soul. Oh Lord, my God, you are very great! You are clothed with splendour and Majesty. (Psalm 104:1) We give thanks to you, Lord God, among the Sunda people. We praise you for the vibrant community and the warm cultural heritage that you have bestowed upon the Sunda. Holy Spirit, we ask that you bring the Sunda into the fold of God's family. Please provide for their basic necessities, protect their health, and renew their soul. Please bring forth new opportunities for commerce, agriculture and education in order to increase their standard of living. Lord, would you reveal your face to them, and envelop them with your love. Amen.





Nepal-Chhetri

The Chhetri people are one of the largest and most influential ethnic groups in Nepal, primarily residing in hilly terrains and traveling on foot. They have many religious, racial, cultural, and linguistic similarities to the people of northern India. Many are farmers living in small villages surrounded by farmland, and are a social community that gather at nearby trees or home porches.

The Chhetris speak Nepali as their primary language and follow Hinduism, with strong ties to rituals and ceremonies. Being a pantheistic faith, they recognize many gods, goblins and spirits, often making offerings to idols in order to gain favour.

Although many resources have been translated, mission work is difficult and dangerous. Christianity is considered a "foreigner's religion" and missionaries are a caste that must not be associated with. Those who perform baptisms risk prison.

PRAY WITH US:

We echo the words of David in the Psalms: "All the nations you have made shall come and worship before you, O Lord, and shall glorify your name. For you are great and do wondrous things; you alone are God" (Psalm 86:9-10). We praise you for the industrious and resourceful Chhetri people in Nepal. Thank you for the cheerfulness in their hearts and the communal nature of their culture. Jesus, we pray that you surprise them with true and everlasting joy - a joy that is beyond compare and can only be found in You. We pray that they would discover that everything that their hearts are searching for can be found in the one true God. Protect the missionaries in this land so that the gospel can continue to spread like wildfire and transform the nation. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Azerbaijani

Islam was introduced to the nation around the 11th century, and today, a majority of the Azerbaijanis, sometimes also called "Azeris", practice the Shia Muslim religion. The country has undergone various invasions throughout centuries: the Persians in 6th century B.C., Turkics in the 11th century A.D., the dominion of Genghis Khan in the 13th century A.D., and finally being incorporated into the Soviet Union by 1922.

The country's terrain is ideal for farming fruits, vegetables, tea, and cattle. A quarter of the population living in the capital city of Baku is involved in various industries, specifically, petroleum. Because of this, Azerbaijan is one of the most developed countries in the South Caucasus.

Family ties and protecting the culture are important to the Azerbaijani, so marriages within extended families were encouraged. Women have less restrictions than most traditional Islamic regions and some even have leadership roles.

Of the 8 million people in the country, only 0.4% are Christian. Close to 10,000 Azerbaijanis live in Canada.

PRAY WITH US:

Dear God Most High, "It is you who have made the heavens and the earth by your great power and by your outstretched arm! Nothing is too hard for you." (Jeremiah 32:17). We lift up the Azerbaijani to you. We pray that they will personally encounter the Creator of the universe. You, who created this land and blessed it with many natural resources, are the same God who provides for their daily needs. May the Azerbaijanis come to realize your pursuit of their hearts. May this nation be transformed by the life-saving message of the gospel. Amen.





Taiwan - Hakka

The Hakka people in Taiwan are an ethnic group with roots in southern China, many of whom are war refugees escaping from the Mongol people. They began migrating to Taiwan in the 17th century, during the Qing Dynasty, and have since become an integral part of Taiwanese society. Many of the elders continue to live in rural communities while the younger generation move into the city for education. Though Mandarin is widely spoken, their heart language is Hakka and they have maintained a strong sense of cultural identity with distinct customs, festivals and cuisine.

Their religious practices combine aspects of Daoism, Buddhism and Confucianism. Commonly they worship the spirits of their ancestors, building shrines and making offerings, believing that these spirits can affect their future and their fortune.

There are about 2% Hakka Christians in the country, and they need to be mobilized in order to bring the gospel to the rest of Taiwan.

PRAY WITH US:

Dear Lord of all creation, we praise and glorify you! Thank you for your guiding hand over the Hakka people in Taiwan. We praise you for the handful of people who have already turned their hearts to you. Would you set their hearts on fire and give them courage to continue witnessing their faith to their communities? In Isaiah 60:2-3, you say: "For behold, darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will be seen upon you. And nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising." We proclaim this truth over the Hakka – and that this whole nation will come to your light! We know that nothing is impossible for you, God. We know that your glory will shine on this nation. We entrust the work of the Church to you. Amen.

Turks in Germany

The Turks are the largest ethnic minority group in Germany. Their roots date back to the 1960s when "Gastarbeiter" (guest workers) were recruited to address labor shortages to work in factories and infrastructure projects. Over time, the community grew through family reunifications and new immigration waves. They brought their religion, culture and tradition with them and now Turkish is the second largest language in Germany.Through conditions have improved, the Turks often face discrimination. Only 1/6th of Turks have German citizenship because Germany does not typically allow for dual citizenship. Because of this, many Turks maintain political ties with Turkey.

The Turks are nominally Sunni Muslim. The tradition of the Sunni is political conformism, though the Turks have been more flexible than many of their Muslim neighbors.

PRAY WITH US:

Lord, you are high above all nations, and your glory above the heavens! (Psalm 113:4). Thank you for the work of your faithful followers who have tirelessly translated many resources into Turkish. Lord, we ask you to please bless the missionary efforts towards the Turks in Germany, that they would encounter the gospel message and know the liberation of your transforming love. We pray that as they continue to shape their Turkish identity amongst German culture that they would encounter their deepest core identity as your sons and daughters. Soften the soil of their hearts, so that when they consider the impact of salvation in their lives, that they would one day come to bask in the light of your glory. This we ask in the name of Jesus, our Lord and Saviour. Amen.





Prayer Team Leaders

Heavenly Father, we thank You for the faithful men and women who lead prayer teams. You have called them to stand in the gap, to intercede for the lost, and to lift up the needs of the Church before Your throne. Strengthen them in their calling, Lord, and fill them with fresh faith and endurance.
