3 regional luncheons recently

Brian writes:

One of the things that I've often heard from members of the **Power Team** in the CPD is that they have not seen fellow members for many years. So, this year, for the first time, we organized 3 luncheons to try and cover as best as possible the CPD area. The Luncheons were held in three areas of the province: Okanagan Valley, Lower Mainland and Vancouver Island.

The first event took place at Mission Creek Alliance in Kelowna. The Point couple for this event was Arnold & Joan Downey, former WCD DS. They did a fabulous job.

There was NO COST for the luncheons as the CPD office was so gracious in covering all costs for those who attended. Special appreciation goes out to the CPD and Mark Peters, DS.

The PURPOSE of each luncheon was two-fold:

- **GETTING RE-ACQUAINTED**: For some it had been over 10 years since they had seen each other. Some had been college class-mates as well as fellow ministers for a number of years. The wholesome chatter at each location was almost overwhelming as they met each other.
- MARK PETERS: District Superintendent: Mark arranged his busy schedule so that he would be at each luncheon. Many who attended did not know or had even met Mark previously. I would love for you to hear what Mark said but in simple terms he:
 - Shared his story:
 - His years of growing up and his family in Surrey and Surrey Alliance
 - His family: wife Naomi and children
 - His desire to go into the medical field
 - How the Lord redirected him into ministry and those whom the Lord used to speak to him
 - His ministry experience in First Alliance (Calgary), North Shore Alliance (North Vancouver) and how the Lord guided him in becoming the DS in the CPD.
 - In each of the locations Mark was able to highlight 2-3 individuals who were present and how the Lord used them in a positive way in ministering to him.
 - Supportive & Encouraging Words:
 - Stated clearly how thankful he is for each person present and the ministry that they had for so many years.
 - Their ministry has changed lives as well as help shape the area of ministry that they were located in.
 - Mark communicated as well that without each person following the Lord's direction in their lives that the Alliance in a positive way would not be what we are today.

- He thanked each one for the continuing ministry that they are having throughout their retirement.
- AND that he values their continued prayers and support for himself, his team and the CPD.

So now what? Well, the message was very clear from everyone that they want more events like this to happen again and very soon!

Coming out of Assembly, one of the themes that was loud and clear was to raise up a new generation of leaders in order to double.

For some pastors it will introduce them to new mission themes and recent books being published which they don't have time to read.


Take the time to listen to her, and to her challenge to support the younger generation. This should fuel our prayers as we see young pastors and IWs reaching the generations younger than ourselves

Deaths of His Servant



David Belsey November 28, 1945 – June 30, 2024

David Alan Belsey, a devoted pastor, educator, and mentor graduated on June 30, 2024, in Toronto, Ontario, at the age of 78 due to complications from chronic lung disease. Born on November 28, 1945, in Midland, Ontario, David spent his life dedicated to his faith, family, and community.

David spent his early years in Midland, where he developed a love for carpentry under the guidance of his father. He displayed his athletic prowess early on, winning a high jump competition in Grade 8 and securing the Jr Track and Field Cup in Grades 9 and 10. Between Grades 10 and 11, David embraced his Christian faith, a decision that shaped the course of his life. His commitment was solidified with his baptism in Grade 11, an event he fondly recalled as marking the experience of his first miracle.

His life in ministry was launched with the preaching of his first sermon at the age of 19. He pursued a Bachelor of Theology degree from Canadian Bible College in Regina, Saskatchewan, graduating in 1968. In 1969, he married the love of his life, Pamela Dolce (nee Klemke), with whom he shared 55 good years.

Continuing his academic pursuits, David graduated with a Master of Divinity degree from Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary in 1972 and later earned a Master's of Theology from the University of Toronto in 1976. His dedication to learning culminated in completing his second dissertation in fulfillment of a Doctorate of Ministry degree from Fuller Seminary in 1998.

David's career was marked by significant contributions to various Christian ministries and educational institutions. David served as a pastor with the Christian and Missionary Alliance in Hamilton, Ontario, and Edmonton, Alberta, mentoring many young people and encouraging over 17 to enter ministry. He established "The Inside Story" Christian Books and Music Store in Edmonton in 1976, and started the first small group in Canada while at Millbourne Alliance Church around 1978.

David's legacy of Christian leadership continued as he became an Associate Pastor at Beulah Alliance Church and oversaw the construction of their new facility on 178th street. He later took on roles as Vice President at Canadian Bible College / Canadian Theological Seminary in Regina, Saskatchewan, and Director of Advancement at Rocky Mountain College. He also served as a member of the Board of Canadian Council of Christian Charities. At the culmination of his influential career, he shared his expertise as a faith-based fundraising consultant helping dozens of churches, camps, and schools expand their work.

David's faith was his anchor, embodied in his favorite scripture, Isaiah 44:8: "Do not tremble; do not be afraid. Did I not proclaim my purposes for you long ago? You are my witnesses—is there any other God? No! There is no other Rock—not one!" His life was a reflection of his belief in the strength and steadfastness of God, whom he served diligently throughout his life.

David's dedication to faith, family, and community left an indelible mark on all who knew him. He will be deeply missed, leaving behind a heritage of faith, love, and service.

The Celebration of David's life took place on July 25, 2024 at First Alliance Church, Toronto, ON.

Harold Elmer Dirks

April 15, 1925 - March 26, 2024

Harold's brother Don Dirks conveyed the following:

My brother Harold did his theological studies at the WCBI (Western Canadian Bible Institute) school in Regina.

From there he pastored in several Saskatchewan towns: ie Hawarden and Elbow. At the same time that they were there, Mel & Marion Sylvester were serving in a nearby town so they were together often for mutual encouragement and fellowship.

He served as Associate Pastor with Alf Orthner in Moosejaw (C&MA) and was also in charge of preparing all of the music for the radio ministry

that Alf had.

He served at one point as pastor of the Beaverlodge church (C&MA) in the Peace River District. He later was in charge of some pioneering ministries of the Alliance further North in the Peace River region. Later he pastored a church in the Okanagan.

Past middle age he accepted a calling from the Wycliffe Bible translators, and after training in Los Angeles he and Kay organized over four dozen fund raiser banquets across Canada.

At one point he traveled with a leading Evangelist in Canada as the Minister of Music.

Harold was a beloved patriarch, a man of deep faith and a prayer warrior who had a tremendous love for his Lord, and family. He lived his life in service to others, and even though he suffered and struggled for many years, he always remained an encouragement and blessing to his care workers and his dear family, right until his passing. His ministry years made him a blessing to many.

None of us will ever forget how he would greet those special to him with his famous 'happy dance'! It brings his family great comfort to know he is free from pain and doing his 'happy dance', reunited at last with his Special K and family gone before him. He fought the good fight and finished the race. Well done good and faithful servant!

He would say "Happyluya, I'm Home"!

Harold was given this verse of comfort not long after losing his dear wife, and he quoted it often:

"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."


